



WHAT TO BRING WITH YOU TO THE BIBLE INSTITUTE

The following furnishings are provided in the rooms:

A single bed with a mattress; a small desk with two drawers; chair; wardrobe (one side for hanging, other side with shelves); a dustbin; a mirror and a bookshelf. There are curtains on the windows and vacuum cleaners are provided for the carpets.

You will need:

1. Bedding (Sheets, cushions, blankets or duvet).
2. Bath Towels.
3. Reading Lamp (not essential).
4. Computers are provided in the library. You may bring your own PC and printer (optional).
5. A multi-plug for electrical appliances (computers, hairdryers etc.) NB: use of kettles, microwaves, two-plate stoves and toasters are **FORBIDDEN** in the rooms – these are provided in the general kitchen.
6. Small mirror for wall/ table cupboard (optional).
7. Fan or Heater (optional) – please note: there is an additional electricity surcharge.
8. Musical Instrument, Radio or CD/MP3 player (optional).

TO WEAR:

1. The general dress code is 'casual' (T-shirt & Jeans and appropriate footwear are acceptable).
2. Neat clothes for church / chapel service (T-shirt & Jeans are **not** acceptable). Men are advised to wear a shirt with a tie (on Tuesdays).
3. Comfortable clothes for gardening.
4. This is a multi-cultural college, thus we ask for the women to wear clothes that are not revealing (spaghetti tops, short shorts, anything that reveals stomach etc.)
5. Swimming costume (Full costume for ladies and no Speedos for men).
6. Hiking boots (optional).
7. Iron (Ironing boards provided, washing machines (R25-00 per load) and driers (R15-00 per load) are provided.
8. Washing pegs and washing basket.
9. Additional hangers.

FOR STUDIES:

1. A4 Writing pads or books for taking notes.
2. Pens, pencils, sharpener and eraser.
3. Highlighters (optional).
4. Files (minimum of one A4 Arch Lever File).
5. Paper punch and for filing notes.
6. Study Bible (Preference: New International Version).
7. An unmarked Bible (non-study Bible) to take into exams.
8. Text-books can be purchased at Christian Book Discounters (CBD) bookstore. The library generally has several copies of each textbook, so the purchase of textbooks is optional.

FOR COOKING (Lunch is provided on weekdays; students cook own breakfast and dinner)

1. Grocery items for breakfast and dinner. Each student is allocated shelf and fridge space for storage.
2. Students have access to the kitchen with stoves, microwave ovens, pots, pans and cooking utensils. Students could bring their own pots pans and cooking utensils.
