



## **WHAT TO BRING WITH YOU TO THE BIBLE INSTITUTE** **(Applies to live-in students)**

### **The following furnishings are provided in the rooms:**

Single bed with a mattress | Small desk with drawers | Chair | Wardrobe (one side for hanging, other side with shelves) | Wastepaper basket | Mirror | Bookshelf | Bedrooms are curtained and carpeted; a vacuum cleaner is available for the carpets.

Not provided: heater, fan, bedside lamp.

### **You will need to provide**

#### **ESSENTIAL:**

1. Bedding (sheets, cushions/pillows, blankets or duvet).
2. Bath towels.
3. A multi-plug plus chargers for electrical appliances (PC, devices, hairdryer etc.) Please note that the use of kettles, microwaves, two-plate stoves and toasters is **not allowed** in any bedroom – these are provided for students in the main kitchen.
4. Hangers for your clothing.
5. Laundry bag and iron (Ironing board is provided).
6. Washing pegs.

#### **NON ESSENTIAL but nice to have:**

1. Reading Lamp.
2. Computers and a printer are provided in the library's computer room but you may bring your own PC or device.
3. Small fan or heater; please note there is an additional electricity surcharge if you use a fan or heater.
4. Small musical instrument, Radio or CD/MP3 player.

## **CLOTHING & FOOTWEAR:**

The general dress code is 'casual' (T-shirt, jeans, sandals, floppies are acceptable in class) Students are required to wear footwear in the main campus classroom building. For the ladies the rule is no shorts or bare shoulders.

1. Neat clothes for church on Sunday and for chapel service on Tuesday.
2. Comfortable clothes for gardening.
3. This is a multi-cultural college, thus we ask for the women to wear clothes on campus that are modest (avoid beach wear, spaghetti tops, skimpy, tight shorts, bare midriff etc.).
4. Swim Wear (Full swimming costume for ladies and board shorts for men - no Speedos or bikinis).
5. Washing machines (R30-00 per load) and driers (minimum R15-00 per load) are provided.

## **FOR STUDIES:**

1. A4 Writing pad or book for taking notes.
2. Pen, pencil, sharpener and eraser.
3. Highlighters (optional).
4. Files (if using loose note paper).
5. Paper punch for filing notes (if necessary).
6. Study Bible (Preference: NIV or ESV).
7. Text-books can be purchased at Christian Book Discounters (CBD) or Good Neighbours/Augustine Book Room. The library generally has several copies of each textbook, so the purchase of textbooks is optional.

## **FOR COOKING**

(A full cooked Lunch is provided on weekdays; students cook their own breakfast and evening meal as well as weekend meals).

1. You will need grocery items for breakfast and evening meal. Each student is allocated shelf and fridge space for storage.
2. Students have access to the kitchen with stoves, microwave ovens, pots, pans and cooking utensils. Students need not bring their own pots pans and cooking utensils.
